<b>Application</b>	<p>This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to prepare yearlings <u>and other classes of stock such as weanlings and mares</u>, for the show ring and for sale. It includes washing, grooming, exercising and feeding <u>yearlings-horses</u>.</p> <p>The unit applies to individuals who use specialised horse knowledge and skills, have responsibility for a work activity, area or team, and provide and communicate solutions for a range of predictable and sometimes unpredictable problems in the horse breeding sector.</p> <p>No occupational licensing or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.</p> <p>Work health and safety and animal welfare legislation relevant to interacting with horses applies to workers in this industry. Requirements vary between industry sectors and state/territory jurisdictions. Users are advised to check with the relevant authority for specific requirements.</p>

<b>Performance Evidence</b>	
<p>An individual demonstrating competency in this unit must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria of this unit. There must be evidence that the individual has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>prepared at least three yearlings <u>and one other horse (mare or weanling)</u> for sale, including:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><u>conditioned yearlings each horse</u> in preparation for sales</li> <li><u>prepared each horse for sale day.</u></li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><u>developing and applying exercise programs and routines in preparation for sales</u>  <u>developing and overseeing nutrition programs and feeding routines in preparation for sales</u>  <u>washing, grooming and trimming yearlings to promote their appeal to buyers</u>  <u>training yearlings to lead up and stand.</u></p>

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.</p>
