Why is this project happening?

The skills and knowledge required to work within the production horticulture, nursery production and retail nursery sectors are often transferable. Many of the challenges and opportunities facing these sectors are similar or related. Increased competition from imported produce, market price pressures, and challenging seasonal conditions are all driving industry to adopt new technologies, process and operations.

The work activities of those involved in the production of plants for human food, fibre and decoration are being reviewed to identify similar skills standards. This information will help to update national units of competency and qualifications that support job roles within these sectors. They are being revised to support flexible career paths and to provide an integrated approach to skills needs across the supply chain.

The Agriculture and Production Horticulture Industry Reference Committee is overseeing this project, as part of their responsibility to support engagement with the sector, and to ensure the project meets industry stakeholder needs.
