

# Game Harvesting Auditing Project

Help support Australia's game harvesting industry by providing advice on skills standards for internal auditing.

While wild game harvesting in Australia has moved towards more formalised training and accreditation requirements, there is still a need for nationally recognised skills standards for the internal auditing and inspecting of game field depots.

Do you have experience in the auditing of game field depots? You're invited to have your say on the skills required to perform internal auditing in the game harvesting industry, for input into the national skills standards.

## Why is this project happening?

The transport of wild game by game field depots is an important step in the supply chain, providing a link between individual game harvesters and meat processors. Skills in internal auditing of game field depots are essential for ensuring biosecurity measures are adhered to and meat is wholesome and safe for human consumption. This is essential for maintaining Australia's reputation for high quality, safe game meat.
