Pet care and animal training project – ACM qualifications development proposal

Background

Skills Impact is undertaking a project to review and redevelop the ACM qualifications related to animal attendants and trainers, pet grooming and styling, companion animals and regulation, which have not been fully reviewed since 2010. Industry has indicated that these are no longer considered fit for purpose and need to be updated to reflect current industry work practices and the changing ways animals are valued, cared for, managed and trained.

During October and November 2019, Skills Impact met with Subject Matter Experts from various sectors of the animal care and management industry from across Australia to undertake workforce functional analysis to identify the typical job roles and work functions in the industry. It has become clear that the current qualifications, especially those at Australian Qualification Framework level 3 and 4 should be redesigned to better reflect the current needs of the industry.

Below is a brief summary of the proposed changes to the qualifications covered by this project. Skills impact is seeking feedback from stakeholders on the proposed ACM qualifications set out below.

We are happy to receive feedback on any of the proposed qualifications, skill sets and new units of competency. In particular, we are keen to hear stakeholder feedback on the following two questions:

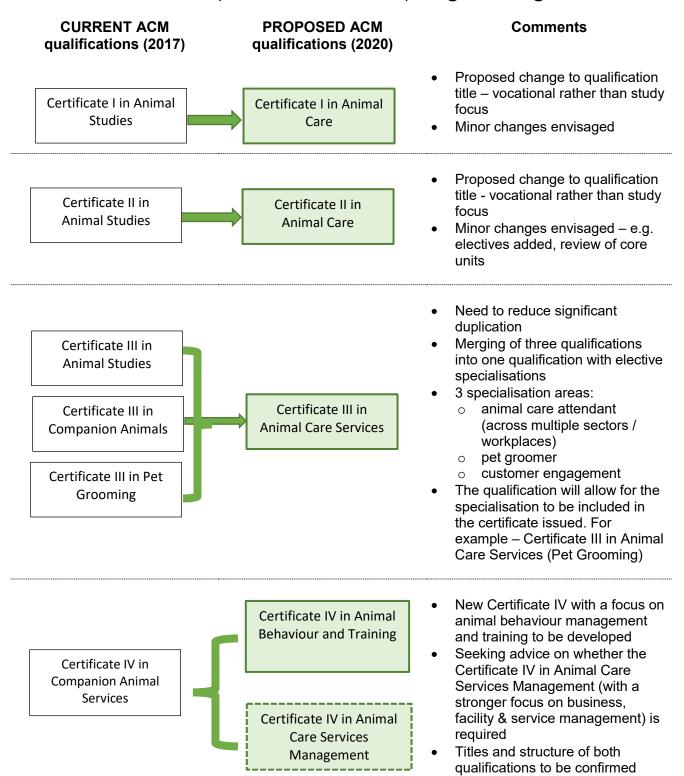

- ACMNEW4X1 Interpret and manage companion animal behaviour (in depth knowledge of behaviour)
- ACMNEW4X2 Coordinate walk and exercise activities for companion animals (dogs?)
- ACMNEW4X3 Assess animal behavioural suitability for different purposes (including human/animal match)
- ACMNEW4X4 Work with animal-assisted service providers
- ACMNEW4X5 Apply disability awareness to animal assisted services

- ACMACR3XX Support veterinary activities in remote communities
- ACMACR3XX Monitor and plan future remote community animal management activities
- ACMACR4X1 Develop and implement an animal management plan (includes understanding of contracting of services)
