TITLE Assessment requirements for ACMEQU210 Lunge educated horses

Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency in this unit must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria of this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has lunged at least three calm, consistent and obedient horses that have been educated to lunge, under supervision, including:

- carrying out basic risk assessments when preparing to lunge horses:
 - identifying hazards and assessing their risks in horse lungeing environment
 - · controlling risks within own role and control
- selecting and fitting lunge gear to horses as directed
- monitoring basic horse health and welfare during lunge exercise and reporting of abnormalities to supervisor
- selecting, using and caring for gear and equipment used for lungeing, including personal protective equipment (PPE)
- · performing pre- and post-exercise lunge procedures according to stable procedures
- using horse lungeing techniques, including:
 - · single lunge rein
 - lunge whip
- controlling horse during walk, trot and canter in both directions.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- workplace procedures for lungeing exercise to horses, including pre-exercise, during exercise and post-exercise procedures
- workplace communication procedures related to conducting non-riding horse exercise programs
- horse lungeing techniques and equipment
- common horse behaviour and management related to lungeing exercise routines and fitness
- general signs of horse injury and fatigue related to exercise programs, and what needs to be reported to a supervisor
- likely injuries that may be sustained by horses and handlers during exercise routines
- · signs of illness and injury related to exercise routines
- safe horse handling techniques and zones when lungeing horses
- lungeing environments and surfaces
- · low stress horse handling techniques
- types and purpose of working gear required for mechanical exercise equipment and for swimming horses
- requirements for checking and maintaining working gear and exercise equipment
- types of exercise routines, and timeframes for horses at various stages of fitness, on mechanical exercise equipment and during swimming
- common workplace health and safety requirements and practices relating to lunging exercise, including:
 - · hazard identification, and risk assessment and risk control and reporting
 - key requirements of work health and safety legislation
 - types and purpose of personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - handling, restraining and lungeing horses
 - · safe storage handling and disposal of treatments, chemicals and cleaning agents
- animal welfare relating to the safe, humane and ethical care of horses
- · workplace horse health reporting systems and practices.

Assessment Conditions

 - an equine riding yard or arena, or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- · resources, equipment and materials:
 - live calm, consistent and obedient horses, educated to lunge, as specified in the performance
 - tack, materials, tools and equipment including PPE suitable for the handler, horses and tasks specified in the performance evidence
- specifications:
 - workplace procedures and instructions or program for lungeing horses
- relationships
 - supervisor

Training and assessment strategies must show evidence of the use of guidance provided in the Companion Volume: User Guide: Safety in Equine Training.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
