Feedback received during the 'drafts available' period for the qualifications has been positive, with minor changes or updates suggested by stakeholders. Validation feedback has also been positive.

Below is a summary of the feedback raised for the draft qualifications, developed, and reviewed for the Greyhound Racing Careers & Jockeys Project, and how these have been dealt with during validation. This involves a consideration of the information provided, views of industry stakeholders and from people who are part of the Subject Matter Expert (SMEs) Working Group process. Resolutions are constructed to consider the needs and views of stakeholders to the extent possible, and to comply with the *Standards for Training Package 2012*. The resolutions may represent a compromise on one or more stakeholder views with the aim of a workable outcome for industry, State and Territory Training Authorities (STAs) and training providers.
