Draft Annual Update to Skills Forecast 2021

Landscaping Project

Information was provided and considered by the IRC in respect to a mapping exercise regarding state accredited courses in WA and VIC for the Certificate IV in Landscape Design. The IRC supported the development of a national qualification and to be included within the current Landscaping Project.

The IRC confirmed the submission date of 30 September 2021 for all three projects.

VET Streamlining and Prioritisation

The IRC discussed the process of the benchmarking tools for the AISC Prioritisation Framework, its implications for the national AHC Agriculture, Horticulture, Conservation and Land Management Training Package and the work necessary from the IRC and industry to maintain any identified qualifications and units of competency.
