Horse Breeding Skills Project

Summary of Feedback, Responses and Actions

March 2019



This project includes the review of three qualifications and 19 units of competency relevant to skills for horse breeding which also involved their migration from the Animal Care and Management (ACM) Training Package to the Racing and Breeding (RGR) Training Package. In addition, two existing qualifications were reviewed and three new units and five skills sets were developed relevant to job roles in the horse breeding industry within the RGR Training Package. Draft qualifications, skill sets and units were reviewed and developed as a result of initial input from Subject Matter Experts (SME) and were made available for broader stakeholder consultation and feedback from 30 October– 9 December 2018. During this time, feedback was received via email, through online surveys, as well as in person at workshops or site visits, and by telephone. Input was sought and received from 37 stakeholders around Australia, including from Principal Racing Authorities (PRA's), Industry representatives, Registered Training Organisations (RTOs), regulatory bodies and government bodies such as state departments and State Training Authorities.

As a direct result of feedback received, a number of changes were made to the documents under review. Mostly notably:

- The units and qualifications relevant to horse breeding, although now sitting within the RGR Training Package, are not specific to racehorses. The units apply to all types and breeds of horses. The selection of electives within horse breeding qualifications allows for specialist skills that are applicable to the racing industry (thoroughbred and harness codes). The units however have general cross-industry application.
- RGR20218 Certificate II in Racing Industry Packaging rules and electives for stud hand specialisation have been updated.
- RGR30418 Certificate III in Racing Services Additional track maintenance stream/specialisation has be added to this qualification.
- Performance evidence specifying how to asses and determine competency for workplace tasks reviewed and updated across all units of competency.
- Addition of newly developed units to elective groupings of horse breeding qualifications where relevant.
- Removal of points duplicating performance criteria in performance evidence and minor changes for clarity across horse breeding units of competency.
- One prerequisite unit has been removed from the suite of units migrated from ACMHBR to RGRHBR prerequisite unit ACMHBR307 Handle young horses removed from RGRHBR306 Raise young horses.
- New unit RGRHBR408 Collect, process and evaluate horse semen for artificial insemination has been revised and will be to be included in horse breeding
 qualifications covering the skills and knowledge required to collect, process, analyse quality and supply horse semen to clients for artificial insemination breeding.
- New unit RGRHBR501 Develop an enterprise horse breeding strategy has been revised and will be included in RGR50X19 Diploma of Horse Breeding covering the skills and knowledge required to plan, develop and implement a horse breeding strategy for an enterprise or stud farm.
- The unit RGRHBR401 Maintain horse stud records, previously ACMHBR309 Follow stud operational procedures, has coded level and title changed to reflect appropriate industry sector usage.
- RGRHBR505 Oversee administration of stud records, previously ACMHBR401 Carry out stud stable management duties, has coded level and title changed to reflect appropriate industry sector usage.

- Units of competency related to Handling Horses and Horse Behaviour (ACMEQU202 Handle horses safely and ACMEQU205 Apply knowledge of horse behaviour) to be considered for future review to investigate unintended consequences of training implementation due to prerequisite requirement chain related to these units refereed to ACM Industry Reference Committee (IRC) for future consideration.
- Including a work placement as part of assessment requirements in horse breeding qualifications was not recommended due to potential barriers for learners to access training and RTO delivery. Assessment requirements to specify an on-the-job focus/requirements.

Below is a summary of the issues raised and how these issues have been dealt with. This involves a consideration of the information provided, views of industry stakeholders where known and views provided by the people who are part of the Subject Matter Expert Working Group process. Resolutions are constructed to take into account the needs and views of stakeholders to the extent possible, and to comply with the *Standards for Training Packages 2012*. The resolutions may represent a compromise on one or more stakeholder views with the aim of a workable outcome for industry, State and Territory Training Authorities (STAs) and training providers.

Summary of feedback

Qualifications

In discussions it was agreed that the migration of units of competency and qualifications related to horse breeding from the Animal Care and Management (ACM) Training Package to the Racing and Breeding (RGR) Training Package be undertaken on the basis that the racing industry is the largest and most complex horse breeding sector. Training package components however will not exclude skills relevant to horse breeding generally and therefore will not be restricted to breeding skills required for the racing sector.

Industry VIC	I am pleased that handle horses safety and apply knowledge of horse behaviour are prerequisite units (the latter being a core unit in the Cert 1). It is not possible to handle racehorses in stables and at trackwork or assist with transport of horses safely if you do not know HOW to handle horses safely or apply knowledge of horse behaviour. That said I would advise that the units ACMEQU202 and ACMEQU205 both need revision in light of the new knowledge that has become available from the research done in the last ten years. Summary of feedback on units of competency

General feedback and issues

New units have been developed to include volume and/or frequency in performance evidence to comply with the Standards for Training Packages 2012 and Foundation Skills included in each. Performance evidence across all units has been reviewed to specify how to asses and determine competency for workplace tasks. Duplication of points included in performance criteria and performance evidence have been identified and minor changes for clarity have been undertaken where required.
