

Diploma and Advanced Diploma of Meat Processing project



Summary of Feedback, Responses and Actions

December 2019

This project includes the review of three qualifications and approximately seventeen units of competency, as well as the development of two new units of competency within the *Australian Meat Processing Training Package*. Draft materials were developed as a result of initial input from Subject Matter Experts and were made available for broader stakeholder consultation and feedback between 14 October and 18 November. During this time feedback was received via email, through online surveys, as well as in person at workshops or site visits, and by telephone. Input was received from five stakeholders around Australia, including one from Registered Training Organisations, one from Government bodies such as State Health Departments and State Training Authorities, and three industry representatives

As a direct result of feedback received, a number of changes were made to the documents under review. Mostly notably:

- No objections have been raised to the proposed deletion of *AMP50115 Diploma of Meat Processing (Meat Retailing)*
- additions to the Performance Criteria and Knowledge evidence of *AMPMGT511 Manage feedlot facility*
- No direct comments were received for any of the reviewed units of competency

Below is a summary of the issues raised and how these issues have been dealt with. This involves a consideration of the information provided, views of industry stakeholders where known and views provided by the people who are part of the Subject Matter Expert Working Group process. Resolutions are constructed to take into account the needs and views of stakeholders to the extent possible, and to comply with the *Standards for Training Package 2012*. The resolutions may represent a compromise on one or more stakeholder views with the aim of a workable outcome for industry, State and Territory Training Authorities (STAs) and training providers.

Summary of feedback on qualifications

AMP60115 Advanced Diploma of Meat Processing

Both comments suggested areas where there may be gaps in coverage, however there are units available at other AQF levels to cover these job functions. The comments were otherwise supportive of the drafts.
