Game harvesting auditing project



Summary of Feedback, Responses and Actions

December 2019

This project includes the development of one unit of competency and one skill set within the *AMP Australian Meat Processing Training Package*. Draft materials were developed as a result of initial input from Subject Matter Experts and were made available for broader stakeholder consultation and feedback between 14 October and 18 November. During this time feedback was received via email, through online surveys, as well as in person at workshops or site visits, and by telephone. Input was received from five stakeholders around Australia, including one from Registered Training Organisations, two from Government bodies such as State Health Departments and State Training Authorities, and two industry representatives.

As a direct result of feedback received, a number of changes were made to the documents under review. Mostly notably:

- The unit of competency AMPG307 Inspect wild game field depot had an additional three performance criteria added, and others were reworded for clarity
- The wording for 'suggested words for Statement of Attainment' was changed to improve clarity.

Below is a summary of the issues raised and how these issues have been dealt with. This involves a consideration of the information provided, views of industry stakeholders where known and views provided by the people who are part of the Subject Matter Expert Working Group process. Resolutions are constructed to take into account the needs and views of stakeholders to the extent possible, and to comply with the *Standards for Training Package 2012*. The resolutions may represent a compromise on one or more stakeholder views with the aim of a workable outcome for industry, State and Territory Training Authorities (STAs) and training providers.

Several minor wording changes were made to this unit as a result of the feedback, and some additions were made to the Performance Criteria.

The seals refer to the depot having the correct seals on doors and windows for hygiene and sanitation. This PC has been reworded for clarity. 3.1 <i>Conduct visual assessment of the field depot to verify it is cleaned and</i> <i>sanitised, seals are intact, the depot is free of rust or flaking paint, and that</i> <i>lighting meets industry standards</i>
• Industry, NSW	PC 3.2 "Confirm there are facilities available to ensure hygiene and sanitation, including adequate supply of potable water, hand wash facilities and facilities for cleaning and sanitising equipment." Ensure? Maybe to enable adequate hygiene and sanitation procedures or operations? Should there be anything about hygiene inspections and documented records?	The TAC considered this and agreed that 'ensure' should be replaced with 'enable'. Another PC has been added 3.3 <i>Confirm that regular hygiene checks have been conducted and recorded,</i> and the remaining PCs renumbered.
• Industry, NSW	PC 3.5 "Verify temperature is monitored and recorded accurately" Nothing mentioned here or below about calibration	The TAC considered this and agreed. The PC has been amended to Verify temperature is monitored and recorded accurately, and that monitoring instruments have been calibrated.
• Industry, NSW	PC 4.1 "Check game carcases are tagged correctly" Should there be records kept to enable traceability?	The TAC considered this and agreed. The PC has been amended to 4.1 Check wild game carcases are tagged and recorded correctly.
