Skills for Land Rehabilitation (Mined Land)

Summary of Validation Feedback, Responses and Actions



This project includes the development of four skill sets and the review of one qualification, within the AHC Agriculture, Horticulture and Conservation and Land Management Training Package. The final draft materials were developed as a result of feedback provided by stakeholders and Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) during the validation period between 31 May and 17 June 2021.

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An online validation meeting was held on the 11 June 2021 where all documents were validated.

Validation feedback was also received from a variety of stakeholders around the country via email and the Skills Impact feedback hub. The table below provides an overview of the groups and jurisdictions that have provided feedback during this phase of the project.
